

Britain Nepal Academic Council (BNAC) Study Days

Every year the Britain Nepal Academic Council (BNAC) runs its “Study Days”, a 2-day conference/workshop on all aspects of research and practical action in Nepal. The Study Days are intended to encourage early career researchers and practitioners to share completed or ongoing work, generate discussions and foster collaborations. Topics are wide ranging, including anthropology, medicine, environment, livelihoods, education, arts, etc., and it’s a great opportunity for established researchers and new faces to mix, share experiences and extend their knowledge of what is going on beyond their expertise in a friendly, welcoming environment.

This year this in-person event is in Edinburgh, on 13 and 14 May, one day at University of Edinburgh, and the other at the Botanic Gardens.
